The Patient Medical Home in New Brunswick a.k.a. Family Health Teams

In our last Summer Newsletter, we advised you that the NB Department of Health had launched their Family Health Teams (FHT) Operational Guide, and was now accepting Letters of Interests Forms from physicians that are interested in being part of a FHT.

To elaborate on this, the NB Department of Health are accepting FHT Letter of Interests Form from FHT's within one of the 33 communities identified by NB Health Council.

Priority consideration will be given to communities that have a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) published by their respective Regional Health Authority. The CHNA will help the FHT establish their strategic plan and identify which programs and services they want to offer. To view the 6 reports published by Horizon Health Network, click <u>here</u>. Another 6 CHNA are expected to be published by the Horizon in March 2015. Vitalité Health Network's CHNA are still pending.

Interested FHT must first submit the Letter of Interest Form & wait to receive confirmation to proceed, and then submit the Application Form. Both forms can be found in the <u>FHT Operational Guide</u>.

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IN THE SPOTLIGHT



Dr Sharon Northorp

Canada's Family Physician of the year 2014 for New-Brunswick

"Being a family physician has been a rewarding career. The most fulfilling part is following generations of patients, from birth to death, and the special relationship I've made with each one."

Dr. Sharon Northorp, from Moncton, New Brunswick, embodies what it means to be a family physician.

A graduate of Dalhousie University's medical school, Dr. Northorp received her certification in family medicine from the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) in 2006. Upon completion of her internship at Dalhousie University in 1987, she started her full-time practice with obstetrics services at Moncton Hospital.

Since 1992, Dr. Northorp has taught at Dalhousie's Department of Family Medicine and is very popular among residents and students. They attest to her knowledge and the passion she instills in each of them, and they appreciate her dedication to mentorship which "goes above and beyond the call of duty."

An advocate for community health and an active committee member, Dr. Northorp has participated with several organizations including the Greater Moncton Area Child Abuse Committee, the Moncton Hospital Board, the Moncton Breastfeeding Promotion Committee, and the Moncton Suicide Prevention Committee.

Dr. Northorp served as president of the New Brunswick College of Family Physicians from 2006 to 2008, and has been a member of the CFPC's Maternity and Newborn Care Committee since 2008. She has been the chair of NBCFP's Bylaws committee for over 8 years. She was selected by the CFPC to serve as Chair for the Reconciliation Panel with Health Canada in 2011.

Dr. Northorp raised her nephew Jeremy and niece Kathy as a single parent and has now been blessed with her first "grandchild!" When not working, Dr. Northorp enjoys gardening, bird watching, and travelling. Regular trips to Cuba provide opportunities for her generous spirit to share with those less fortunate. Even her vacations are an act of kindness.



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Questions and Answers

Q: I have patients that ask me to prescribe **marijuana** for their chronic pain, but I don't know enough about this treatment to feel comfortable prescribing it. Do any reliable resources exist?

K: The CFPC released the following preliminary document to guide family physicians in this area: <u>Authorizing Dried Cannabis for Chronic Pain or Anxiety: Preliminary Guidance</u>

Q: Myself and other colleagues meet on a regular basis for **hospital/clinical rounds**, is this something that we could have Mainpro accredited?

- A: Hospital or clinical rounds are eligible for Mainpro-M1 accreditation if developed and implemented in compliance with the requirements for provincial Mainpro-M1 accreditation as well as the specific guidelines listed here. Accreditation must be sought on an annual basis.
 - 1. The department of family medicine or another relevant department of medicine will select topics based on a needs assessment informed by rounds evaluations, regional initiatives, physician-leader experiences, conversations with colleagues, and newly arising practice issues.
 - 2. The needs assessment is to be used as the basis for establishing learning objectives and program design and content.
 - 3. The department must select an appropriate speaker or presenter as determined by the topic:
 - The department should advise the speaker of Mainpro-M1 accreditation requirements.
 - Presentations must be generated by speakers, not by external agencies or individuals.
 - 4. The department will select an appropriate venue and timing for presentations (should not be held external to the hospital or clinic unless the venue is appropriate for teaching and learning (eg, a university auditorium).
 - 5. The department is responsible for advertising the rounds and providing registration, including attendance monitoring and providing a certificate of attendance bearing the Mainpro accreditation statement, on an annual or semi-annual basis (minimum).
 - 6. All costs associated with the rounds, including speaker honoraria and food or refreshments for participants, will be paid by the department using pooled funds accumulated from unrestricted educational grants (may be from industry), provincial grants, and the like.
 - 7. The department will gather evaluation data from presentations and will use this information to establish learning objectives for the following year.
