President's Report

It has been a year since I became the president of the Manitoba College of Family Physicians; time enough to settle in and reflect upon where we are as an organization and the trajectory that lies ahead.

The post COVID period has come with significant challenges for both our membership as well as our College. I am thankful to Dr. Joanna Lynch, our past president, for her guidance and support during this period. My gratitude as well to our executive director, Lisa Goss, for her enduring efforts in restricting costs without sacrificing the quality. The untimely withdrawal of transfer payments and other surplus funding from the CFPC, has significantly constrained our ability to deliver an optimal range of services to our members. Despite this, we continue to offer quality CME and our efforts to advocate on members' behalf has been unrelenting.

Indeed, COVID was the spark that lit a fire. Yet, in many ways, that tinder bed has been threatening to ignite for a long time. Years of undermining the value of family medicine, and subsequent underfunding, has created what many call a "crisis in family medicine." Whilst some perseverate on the doom and gloom scenario embodied in "crisis," I prefer to look upon this as an opportunity to re-evaluate the way primary care is delivered in Canada. Those who are serious about solving the problem of patient access to primary care must ensure that we devise strategies that will make that a priority deliverable. Team based care holds much promise, but the catchall phrase needs to be framed in a more meaningful way: who will make up such teams, under what conditions will they operate, how will participating providers be funded, and above all, how many new people will be enrolled into such a primary care team. I believe that our new government in Manitoba will be receptive to working together with us in shaping a primary care system that is value driven and one that meets our current and future needs.

A bright collaborative future lies ahead for our College. Serving member interest will always remain as our main focus, but we need to engage more readily with patients so that we appreciate their perspectives, understand their priorities, and incorporate their vision when creating viable solutions. It is equally imperative, to work together with partner organizations, in a manner that will enable a unified front in terms of advocacy and negotiations with government and other healthcare stakeholders. This kind of synergy can only bring greater value to our membership.

As the only organization in Manitoba that is solely representative of Family Doctors, I feel encouraged that the Manitoba College of Family Physicians will move ahead with a clear strategic plan to further our members' interests in this period of transition.

Despite the challenges in 2023, our commitment to advocating for our members and advancing family medicine remained unwavering. The ratification of a new Physicians Services Agreement between Manitoba Health and Doctors Manitoba in August 2023 marked a pivotal moment for family medicine, bringing hope for the future. As we move forward, we anticipate a period of recalibration as we navigate the implications of this new model.

Throughout the fiscal year, the Manitoba College of Family Physicians remained steadfast in its commitment to representing the interests of family physicians in Manitoba. We engaged with key stakeholders to ensure that family physician perspectives were heard and considered in policy-making. Additionally, we continued to deliver exceptional continuing professional development (CPD) opportunities, including the delivery of the first hybrid Annual Scientific Assembly (ASA). For the first time, we included a resource room to provide supports for your practice.

Our financial standing remains stable due to prudent surpluses accumulated over the past three years. However, navigating challenges stemming from revenue loss proved daunting, resulting in my first career budget deficit. Nonetheless, we persevered, spearheading initiatives such as our Family Doctor Day communication campaign and advocating for the expansion of e-consult. The MCFP having a voice in the work in developing recommendations to alleviate administrative burden underscored our commitment to our members. Additionally, our efforts to integrate Elder or Knowledge Keeper services into primary care programs highlighted our dedication to team-based care.

As we look ahead, we recognize the complex challenges facing Family Medicine in Manitoba. With your support, we are optimistic about our ability to address them together. Your confidence in our organization sustains us, and we are committed to continuing to advocate for our members.

In closing, I eagerly anticipate the year ahead, and listening to your needs throughout our strategic planning process. Your contributions will be invaluable in shaping the trajectory of family medicine in Manitoba.

Optimizing Team-Based Primary Care

The Manitoba College of Family Physicians (MCFP) played a pivotal role in supporting Northern Connections Medical Center's initiatives to improve primary care services and address community needs. The collaboration began with an immPACC Mapping session, focusing on overcoming healthcare access barriers in vulnerable communities.

Expanding on the session's outcomes, MCFP aided Northern Connections in integrating Indigenous Elder services into their primary care team. Subsequently, when the opportunity for the Optimizing Team-Based Primary Care Grant emerged, MCFP provided crucial assistance in grant writing and project implementation. Led by Dr. Mandy Buss, the grant aimed to center Indigenous knowledge systems in comprehensive primary care, aligning with priorities identified in the mapping session.

Anticipated challenges, including systemic racism and resource limitations, were addressed through pragmatic goal-setting, ongoing education, and improved communication within the team and community. Evaluation strategies focused on assessing the integration of new health professionals, team effectiveness, and patient/provider experiences.

The partnership between Northern Connections Medical Center and MCFP underscores the significance of collaborative efforts and community engagement in healthcare. By aligning priorities, leveraging resources, and mutual support, both teams worked towards enhancing team-based comprehensive primary care delivery and promoting health equity within the community.


Dr. Gary Beazley Patients Medical Home Award

Through the Patient's Medical Home model, patients receive comprehensive care from the diverse team of healthcare providers. As the sole medical clinic in Dauphin, the DMC is well-positioned to identify service gaps and respond to community needs, such as the development of a Harm Reduction Clinic in recent years.

Treasurer's Report

Valued Members,

The Manitoba College of Family Physicians Inc. is pleased to present the summary of our 2022/2023 Audit. Despite facing unforeseen revenue losses, our diligent financial management ensured that expenses remained well under budgeted amounts. Total revenue for the fiscal year amounted to \$348,393, with significant contributions from membership services, administration, and continuing professional development. However, certain expected revenues were not realized, including withheld funding from the national body due to the CFPC deficit and decreased attendance at key events. Consequently, we experienced a deficit of \$-137,137, a departure from our historical surpluses.

Financial Position:

As of October 31, 2023, the Organization's financial snapshot reveals total assets of \$766,835, including cash reserves of \$296,551. Liabilities stood at \$227,730, leading to net assets of \$539,105.





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


Budgeted Revenue





Historical Financial Position




