5. President's Report

Dr. Lynch highlighted the following: acknowledging the importance of family medicine and spoke to the issues and needs of family physicians. She gave a heartfelt thanks to Executive Director Lisa Goss, to the board and the staff of the College and is excited to see the College carry forward under the leadership of Dr. Abbu.

6. Executive Director's Report

Lisa expressed her deep gratitude and admiration for the family physicians of Manitoba and gave her thanks to the staff, board, and volunteers at the ASA. She voiced her commitment to supporting the College and membership and looks forward to continuing to work together.

7. CFPC President's Report

Dr. Christie Newton acknowledged family physicians' issues and assured the CFPC is listening and responding to their concerns and highlighted some work the CFPC has been doing on their behalf; including working on practice reform and education transformation. The CFPC has issued six position papers on topics members find most important including addressing administrative burden, locum support, workforce supply, practice infrastructure support, compensation modernization and equity. These reports have influenced the House of Commons' Standing Health Committee and shows in their report "Addressing Canada's Health Workforce Crisis." The CFPC has launched team primary care training for training, a large employment and social development Canada grant that funds 65 health transformation projects across Canada and continues to support provinces through the Patients Medical Home. The CFPC is committed to working with federal partners and provincial chapters to advocate more funding & new investments reflecting the importance of Family Medicine in Canada's healthcare system. They have put together task force groups for anti-racism and education reform. CFPC is currently in the process of new strategic planning and looks forward to working together to make a lot more positive change. Dr. Newton gave her congrats on another successful year although it has not been an easy one.

8. Report of the Nominating Committee

Dr. Lynch gave a few words on the nominating committee structure and mentions the MCFP has moved to a skill-based board structure several years ago to ensure a roster of high-quality candidates that have the skills and diverse perspectives to fulfill their role. The nominating process includes interviews and using the ideal board member and matrix tools, before being reviewed and presented to membership followed by an extensive orientation. With no other questions or comments, Dr. Lynch made the following motion.
